Impact returns nine players from 2007 and two talented newcomers will round out the team.

Impact will feature a top-notch veteran pitching staff including Kasey Estes and

Summer Rattliff, one of only two 13 year olds on the team, both of Greensburg and newcomer Erin Charles of Mt. Sterling. Estes pitches for Green County High School and Charles for Montgomery County. Rattliff is currently playing only travel ball.

Catching duties will be shared by Mallory Stein of Louisville and Jade Hayes of Campbellsville. Stein catches for Ballard High School and Hayes is the Green County catcher.

Impact is blessed with an abundance of multi-talented players that can handle just about any position on the field. The Impact coaching staff will most likely place players in different positions before deciding on the lineup that benefits the team the most.

Kaitlyn Cassidy of Georgetown played a tough right field for last year's team. "Kat" could also see some time at second base. Bailey Gilkerson, a 13 year old from Georgetown, who plays centerfield, has a ton of experience at that position. Cassidy and Gilkerson play for Scott County. Molly Bellamy of Glasgow anchored the left field position for last year's team and could also get some playing time at second base or short this year. Bellamy plays high school ball at Barren County.

Courtney Woods hails from Paducah, played shortstop and centerfield for last year's Impact team and will see time at both positions this year. Woods plays high school ball at Graves County.

Newcomer Rebecca Robinson from Lexington is another versatile athlete that can play several different positions including third base, second base and shortstop. Robinson plays high school ball for Lexington Christian. Erin Charles, also a newcomer to the team, can also play several different positions when not pitching and will see time at second base, shortstop or outfield.

Offensively, Impact should be able to hold their own against most if not all 14 and under teams. Impact features a mix of speed and power in the lineup and all of the hitters have been in big game situations many times before.

2008 Tournaments to Feature Several ISA Events and a World Series in July

The Kentucky Impact 2008 schedule has not been set in stone but will feature several top notch ISA events in Tennessee. Possible stops include Crossville, Clarksville, Morristown and a couple of trips to Pigeon Forge.

Impact will also compete in the 2008 ISA World Series that will be held in July at McDonough, Georgia.

Coach Henry Estes says "it will be impossible to set a schedule until we know how the girls' high school teams fared in the district and regional playoffs". The high school state tournament is slated for June 6-7 at Jack Fisher Park in Owensboro, Kentucky. "There's a good chance that some of the girls will be there that weekend with their high school teams".

We have girls from several of the top ranked high school programs across Kentucky. Ballard, a seventh region power, Scott County, an 11th Region power, and Montgomery County, one of the 10th region's top teams, have good chances of reaching the high school state tournament. Barren County from the fourth region and Green County from the fifth region also have legitimate chances to win their regions.

One thing is for certain, after the high school state tournament is completed, there will only be a limited number of available weekends to compete before heading off to the World Series in July. Impact will probably make use of most or all of those weekends to prepare the team for the World Series. Coach Estes states, "that due to the lack of practice time as a team, we will need those tournaments to experiment with the lineups and to allow the team to gel before the World Series".
